Conc.: Conflict Minerals

There has been much ado about the rules for section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, requiring U.S. publically traded companies to trace four "conflict minerals" in their products and up the supply chain. The aim is to disclose whether Tantalum, Tin, Tungsten and Gold originate from conflict mines in the Democratic Republic of Congo and other adjoining countries.

As part of our corporate social responsibility and to be responsive to several of our customers in regard to these U.S. requirements, we hereby state that our products, Tubtara® blind rivet nuts in all materials (steel, aluminum, and stainless steel) do not contain any of the four above mentioned conflict minerals.
